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2011 WVCST ANNUAL REPORT EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The College continuously aspires for excellence in the field of science and technology. With this aspiration, WVCST President Dr. Luis M. Sorolla, Jr., together with the Vice-President for Academic Affairs Dr. Ricardo B. Abaleña and the Officer-in-Charge for Administration and Finance Dr. Nehema K. Misola spearheaded the following major accomplishments with the full cooperation of the faculty, staff, students, community leaders and other stakeholders;

INSTRUCTION

GRADUATES

The College has produced a total of 2,895 graduates for the academic year 2010-2011 which is considerably lower by 6% from the previous academic year. This is the second year that the College observed a decrease in the number of graduates.

When broken down as to campuses, 46.36% (1,342) of the graduates were from the main campus, 34.78% (1,007) were from the Miag-ao campus (SIPC), 7.94% (230) were from the Dumangas campus (PDMC), 6.80% (197) were from the Leon campus (LNCA) and 4.11% (119) were from the Barotac Nuevo campus (DJSMMNC). The decrease in the number of graduates was observed in the main campus as well as in the Leon and Barotac Nuevo campuses. To address this problem, the College is currently working out some strategies.

When clustered by discipline, the bulk of graduates belong to the Engineering and Technology cluster (58.86%) followed by Information Technology (IT)-related disciplines (17.27%) and Education, Science and Teacher Training (15%).

ENROLMENT

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The College has a total number of enrollees of 11, 588 students for the first semester, AY 2011-2012 which is 4.6% higher than that of the previous year. When broken down as to campuses, 60.08% (6,962) were from the main campus, 22.79% (2,641) were from the Miag-ao campus (SIPC), 6.62% (767) were from the Leon campus (LNCA), 5.60% (649) were from the Barotac Nuevo campus (DJSMMNC), and 4.91% (569) were from the Dumangas campus (PDMC).

During the second semester of the same academic year, a decrease in the number or enrollees was notable. The College enrollment was relatively reduced by 7.7%.

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INSTRUCTIONAL ACTIVITIES

To facilitate learning and promote capability-enhancement, students were sent to various trainings/seminars/OJT programs/industry immersions. Thirteen (13) students of BS Mechanical Engineering major in Automotive Engineering (the first in the country) passed the OJT entrance examination of Toyota Motors Philippines (TMP) in Laguna and seven (7) were admitted to Toyota Iloilo Inc. (TII).

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The College of Education (COE) Junior Council sponsored the Symposium on Molding the Future Mentors. Also, the Dumangas campus conducted a one-day lecture on Job-Readiness Program, Company Policies, Human Relations, Leadership, Morale and Productivity, Consumer Behavior and Ethics and Etiquette in Business and Industry. Furthermore, a seminar-workshop on Career Preparedness and Personality Enhancement was conducted to the third year students.

The Barotac campus conducted skills training on Microsoft Word, Excel, Powerpoint, Photoshop and Basic Computer Troubleshooting for the BSED students. It also conducted an Orientation-Seminar for Student Teachers.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

The College of Industrial Technology developed a new course coding/listing to be included in the College Almanac. Its Electrical Technology section has submitted the Electrical Course Almanac to change the course number of technology subjects, to rationalize the technology subject offerings with the inclusion of the latest trends in the different technology areas and for the inclusion of additional General Education subjects as stated in CMO 54 series of 2007. Moreover, the HRT program revised its curriculum. The Mechanical Technology department enriched its BIT curriculum and the registered competency-based curricula to TESDA. It also developed the standardized ICA in SMAW NCI and Machining NC II and a standardized final examination in all subjects. BFAT and BIT-FAT added ICT courses for the first year students. These were originally offered in the College of Arts and Sciences. The Electronic Technology department enriched the contents of FLX 312 (VCR System) and dissolved ELX 223 (Entrepreneurship) which is a duplication of IT 411 ELX 223 will be changed to Cellular Communication and Repair.

The establishment of the Cyber Web Learning and Training Center was proposed by Dr. Renato M. Sorolla, CPSC fellow.

Revisions were made on the following curricular programs of the College of Arts and Sciences: Bachelor of Science in Mathematics (BSM), Bachelor of Science in Community Development (BSCD), Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (BSCS), Bachelor of Science in Information Systems (BSIS) and Bachelor of Science in Information Technology (BS Info Tech).

The Dumangas campus established a partnership with Isuzu Iloilo in the enhancement of its Automotive Technology program. Furthermore, it borrowed one unit of lathe machine from its sister school, the Don Jose Sustiguer Monfort Memorial College in Barotac Nuevo, Iloilo to be used by BIT Mechanical Technology II.

The Barotac Nuevo campus implemented the curriculum found in the College Almanac for all programs, prepared and enriched the course syllabi for new subjects, developed instructional materials for the laboratory activities of students and observed classes in cooperating schools in the Field Study subjects. It also prepared instructional gadgets for the second semester, 2011.

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ACCREDITATION AND CERTIFICATION

The Marine Engineering Department received its BS EN ISO 9001:2008 Certificate #: AJA01/3635 from the AJA Registrars last 17 February 2011.

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The B.S. Mathematics course was accredited by the AACCUP Team for Level III status while the B.S. Information Technology and the B.S. Computer Science programs were accredited Level I status on 5-7 December 2011. B.S. Architecture, B.S. Electronics and Communications Engineering, B.S. Electrical Engineering, B.S. Marine Engineering and B.S. Hotel and Restaurant Technology were accredited Level I status.

The Barotac Nuevo campus (DJSMMMNC) revisited the Self-Survey of the BSEd, BSIT, BSHRT and BIT curricula and prepared the AACCUP PPP forms for the Pre-Survey Visit and the Self-Evaluation documents on IQUAME.

The Miag-ao campus (SIPC) submitted five curricular programs for the Preliminary Survey last 11-13 May 2012. Its programs were awarded Candidate Status whose validity is from 16 May 2011 to 15 May 2013. In addition, it prepared for the First Survey Visit of the Bachelor of Science in Information Technology and the Second Survey Visit for the Bachelor of Secondary Education.

RESEARCH

Researches

The College has seven (7) completed faculty researches. These researches were accomplished by sixteen (16) faculty researchers and five (5) student researchers. The College looks forward to the completion of seventeen (17) on-going faculty researches and projects. The Barotac Nuevo campus published an institutional research journal containing a compilation of student researches for SY 2009-2010.

The Leon campus has seven (7) completed faculty researches and three (3) on-going researches with the help of five (5) student research assistants. The Miag-ao campus has three (3) completed researches and two (2) on-going researches. Dr. Raul Muyong, Campus Administrator, presented a paper during the CHED-PASUC National Forum on SUC - Private Partnership on Education in Economic Zones held at the Aklan State University, Banga, Aklan on 17-19 August 2011. The title of his paper was Rosemar Techaide Foundation and SIPC-WVCST Miagao Campus Private-Public Partnership on Resource - Generation and Mobilization.

The College faculty researchers also actively disseminated their research outputs through publications in reputable journals and paper presentations in different international and national fora and conferences.

Research Activities

The Western Visayas College of Science and Technology serves Region 6 as host institution of the Innovation and Technology Support Office (ITSO). The Office is the leading provider of intellectual property services outside of Metro Manila. Since its opening, it has actively served clients and attended conferences to enhance the technical capability of its staff. In line with the latter, the Research Services Division (RSD) staff attended several trainings/workshops on intellectual property and patent search information strategies. The trainings were conducted by various concerned agencies such as DOST-TAPI, IPOPhiL, WIPO, EU-TRTA, IIPI, and USPTO in preparation for the establishments of the ITSOs in the country which were launched formally in March 2012. The Deputy General of IPOPhiL, Atty. Andrew Ong, visited the College to check ITSO and its facilities. In addition, RSD conducted a

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one-day seminar-workshop on research capability - building on the topic Invent School Program for Faculty last 25 August 2011 at the Miag-ao campus (SIPC). The Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) sponsored the 2011 Advanced Intellectual Property Information Facilitator (IPi-Facilitator) Program. The online course, offered to the members of the ITSOs, was sponsored by the Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO) and the Korean Invention Promotion Association (KIPA). Dr. Carmelo Ambut and RSD staffers Bethel Bacabac and Lavinia Dulla passed the course.

RSD has distributed the second and third issues of its newsletter. The Office also forwarded five (5) instructional materials developed by the College faculty members for copyright and ISBN registration. The Leon campus developed one (1) module Agricultural Crops Production NC II utilized by its partner and sending organization in Nagano, Iwate, Japan which was made during the trainings on agriculture cultivation. The Miag-ao campus also developed eight (8) instructional materials.

The ISUY anti-mosquito technology was presented during the general faculty meeting last June 2011 at the EdTech Center. It consisted of four mosquito repellants: ultrasonic mosquito repelling device, mosquito repellant by turbulence waves, mobile phone-powered mosquito repellant and mosquito-repelling wrist strap.

RSD through its different centers conducted in-house/technical reviews to come up with quality researches for SY 2011-2012. The Miag-ao campus held a Research Paper Presentation and In-House Review in which fifteen (15) completed research papers and five (5) research proposals were presented.

The College hosted the PASUC VI 2nd Regional Student Research Symposium participated by faculty and students from the different state universities and colleges in the region. WVCST also joined the Regional Invention Contest and Exhibit (RICE) 2011 held last 19-21 October 2011 at Amigo Plaza Mall, Iloilo City.

Research Director Dr Carmelo Ambut conducted R & D campaigns in Iloilo to raise public awareness on research and development. Moreover, he attended consultative meetings on intellectual property protection and met with DTI representatives to discuss possible marketing opportunities and strategies for WVCST products.

Other faculty and staff researchers were also sent to various international, national, regional and local conventions/conferences/semmars which could be an avenue for obtaining new knowledge and the sharing of research practices. Some of these were the Regional Research Symposium for faculty and students organized by PASUC VI, regional and national conventions on statistics, International Conference on Higher Education Research, and many others.

Inventions and Innovations

The College submitted eighteen (18) patent and utility model applications for registration. Three (3) of these applications were granted utility model registrations by IPOPhil. Another five (5) patent applications were on Substantive Examination (Phase II).

Two (2) more utility model applications for physics apparatus were forwarded to IPOPhil for registration.

Several inventions of the faculty researchers are now on production and for sale such as the following: valve spring remover with seal puller of Mr. Jogie Cubar; folding tailor's square of Mr. Lino Baldevarona; electronic water-level controller of Mr. Julius Catalan, Dr. Renerio Mucas and Dr. Antonio Derequito; and the physics apparatus of the PULSaR team.

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Three (3) student research papers received awards during the PASUC VI 2nd Regional Research Symposium for Students held at WVCST last 17 March 2011. In the technological research category, Mohammad Abdullah Takahan and his co-researchers for their research paper SMS-Based Alarm System won the Best Paper. Refrigerant Charging and Recovery Device for Domestic Refrigeration and Air-Conditioning of Noe Baldevarona and his co-researcher won 2nd place. In the social science category, Carr Brian Griño presented The Differing Labor Structures in Southeast Asian Countries which also won 2nd place.

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EXTENSION

The College extended support to the community through its various extension programs: community organizations, education, socio-economic programs, health and nutrition, environmental, and other social services coupled with monitoring and evaluation. Through the Extension Services Division (ESD), the College has a total of 86 extension activities/projects. The Division also conducted a short-term training program in **Basic SMAW-Welding and Fabrication** for the Iloile Juvenile Welfare Association (IJWA). Some of the beneficiaries of these activities were the BLD kids, Dalayunan Boys, preschoolers, elementary pupils and parents, street children and the partner agencies' beneficiaries.

The College ESD received several certificates for tree-planting and appreciation and commendations from various agencies such as the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, Community Environment and Natural Resources Office, Maasin Watershed Forest Reserve Protected Area Office. Daanbanwa, Lambunao, Iloilo, Educational Research and Development Assistance Foundation, Inc., Philippine Red Cross Western Visayas Regional Blood Center, Department of Labor and Employment Regional Office No. VI. Jollibce Foundation, Inc., SM City, Iloilo, and the Iloilo City government.

Competent personnel also offered expert services in their capacities as resource persons/speakers, TESDA competency assessors, thesis and dissertation advisers, judges, accreditors, sports coaches/officials, documenters, and consultants.

PRODUCTION

The main campus has generated Php 6, 824, 532 79 from its income-generating projects. Its Drawing and Drafting faculty contributed to production by designing logos, streamers, and mascots during Dinagyang 2011, and ROTC T-shirts. They also prepared various streamers and stage decorations for the College. The HVAC-RT faculty did the troubleshooting and cleaning of the air-conditioning system of DENR and Greenwich Fast Food in Iloilo City. The Civil Technology faculty members were involved actively in the College IGP through the production of various kinds of furniture, wooden trophies, plaques, give-aways and souvenirs. They also repaired/restored/re-upholstered furniture seats. The HRT department contributed to production by sewing the uniforms of different institutions/agencies and for various activities.

The Leon campus continues to have various IGP's such as piggery; production from rice, corn, vegetables/ fruits, and seedlings; rentals of equipment, etc. The campus has received various donations: five thousand (5,000) seedlings of a new breed of narra and other indigenous species of fruit-bearing and economic trees from DENR; five (5) Balikbayan boxes which contained references, magazines, journals, office and school supplies and other materials for the LNCA populace from US benefactors; farm supplies and materials from KOICA; references and magazines from SEANAFE/PAFERN; books from SEAMEO/SEARCA; rain gauge from SEAMEO-RECSAM in Malaysia; magazines and newsletters from WAC/ICRAF; newsletters from DABAR; and references on rice from PHILRICE.

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The pineapple plantation of the Dumangas campus with CHED as partner has already harvested the first crop and the rest of the plantation is still on vegetative stage. The College Administration has submitted a proposal to enter into a joint venture with Artech Philippines, Inc. represented by Engr. Reynaldo Uy to develop the 80-hectare farm lot into a sugarcane plantation. Also, the repair of the Technology Building is completed with a project cost of Php 250,000.00 sourced from the Congressional fund of Congressman Ferjenel Biron. Short-term courses on driving, computer literacy, CAD, and many others under the ETC program are continuously gaining confidence among professionals and OSY who availed of the program which will eventually contribute to the income of the campus.

The Barotac Nuevo campus generated Php 116,795.53 from its income-generating projects such as the bakery, canteen, BSEd mini-mart, Internet cafe, test booklets, garments, rentals, and catering services.

The Miag-ao campus generated Php 358, 523.18 from its IGP's such as cafeteria, bakeshop, rentals, ID cards, Internet use, Riso, certification forms and Xerox.

PHYSICAL FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT

The WVCST main campus has established the Entrepreneurial Lane Phase 2. The covered footwalk, lawn tennis backstop and perimeter fence fronting the mini-hotel are some of the completed infrastructure projects. A library extension and the WVCST Hometel have also been proposed

The Dumangas campus repair of the parapet of the Technology Building with funding from the PDAF of Cong. Biron in the amount of Php 250,000 00 is almost complete. Moreover, the campus has officially opened the **Dr. Narciso D. Monfort Memorabilia Exhibits** at the 2rd floor of the PDMC Congressional Library. Students and faculty from different schools in the province of Iloilo come to visit the place and appreciate the work of one of the great men of Dumangas.

The Leon campus together with the Department of Agriculture. RO VI has purchased 1 unit of compost shredder with engine, 2 units of iea brewer, 10 units of vermi beds and 15 kgs. of African night crawlers.



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







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
> Distribution of Enrolment by Program Level, First Semester, AY 2011-2012






2. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2010-2011

4. Distribution of Graduates by Program Level, AY 2010-2011



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

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
Distribution of Enrolment by Cluster of Discipline, First Semester, AY 2011-2012





3. Enrolment by Program Level, First Semester, AY 2011-2012

4. Distribution of Enrolment by Program Level, First Semester, AY 2011-2012











ACCREDITATION

The Administration submitted five curricular programs for Preliminary Survey on 11-13 May 2011. These were the Bachelor of Science in Hotel and Restaurant Technology, Bachelor of Industrial Technology, Bachelor of Science in Automotive Technology, Bachelor of Science in Electronics Technology and Bachelor of Science in Electrical Technology. Based on the results, the five programs were awarded **Candidate Status** whose validity starts from 16 May 2011 to 15 May 2013. Based on the AACCUP Board Action, the Administration may apply for the First Survey Visit of the five programs a year after the Preliminary Survey.

To prepare for the First Survey Visit of the Bachelor of Science in Information Technology and Second Survey Visit of the Bachelor of Secondary Education, an orientation and a series of meetings were conducted by Area chairs with their members. 




> Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, 4Y 2010-2011






Distribution of Graduates by Program Level, AY 2010-2011










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



Distribution of Enrolment by Program Level


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> Comparative Enrolment by Semester and by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2011-2012



> Comparative Enrolment by Semester and by Programs Level, AY 2011-2012







Forty (40) members of the faculty and staff joined the educational tour and planning workshop in Dumaguete City last 27-30 April 2011. This aimed to renew camaraderie and develop a good working relationship, build a stronger team and make it an avenue for an efficient and effective organization.

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> Curriculum Development

- 1. The College Administration has decided to terminate the partnership between PDMC and Don Bosco Iloilo effective 2nd Semester, AY 2010-2011 for the reason that it has to implement a new program, the Bachelor in Industrial Technology major in Mechanical Technology to ensure quality of instruction. Enrolment and classes of Mechanical Technology students took effect during the 2nd semester.
- 2. The College actively participated in the review and finalization of the College Almanac subject to approval by the Board of Trustees. Likewise, the IT Department is also preparing for a Preliminary Survey Visit for the Bachelor of Science in Information Technology which is scheduled in Summer 2012.
- 3. Utilization of income and government subsidy are prioritized in the procurement of books and instructional materials and equipment to improve and modernize classroom instruction specifically the use of the multi-media equipment.
- The College is establishing a partnership with Isuzu Iloilo in the development of its Automotive Technology program. One of the benefits of the partnership is the availment of all field parts for instructional use, on-the-job training of students and faculty, industry or field visit and other available opportunities that the company may offer As of this time, the field parts have already been delivered to the College.
- To equip students with the appropriate machine for use by the BIT Mechanical Technology II students, the College was able to borrow one unit lathe machine from its sister school, the Don Jose Sustiguer Monfort Memorial College in Barotac Nuevo, Iloilo

EXTENSION

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- > The College has actively established linkages with LGU Dumangas and the neighboring barangays in bringing the services needed by the clients
- > In close collaboration with the Extension Services of the main campus, the College has done its contribution in the development of the community through its extension activities. One major activity is the Busog Lusog Program of the Jollibee Foundation with Calao Elementary School pupils as the beneficiaries of the said project. Aside from the feeding program, the same school has also availed of free school supplies, construction supplies, and six (6) tables used in the feeding activity. Further, an initial talk was presented to the Parents Teachers Association (PTA) officers regarding the skills training that the College shall extend to the interested parents of the school children.

PRODUCTION

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- > The CHED-financed pineapple plantation project in Agalalana, Passi City is still an on-going project. It has already harvested crops in the first hectare and the rest of the plantation is still on vegetative stage and being properly maintained by the College. Its fourth hectare was fully planted with healthy suckers. The market aspect of the project is now being fully studied by a committee.
- The College Administration has submitted a proposal to enter into a joint venture with Artech Philippines, Inc. represented by Engr. Reynaldo Uy to develop the 80-hectare farm lot into a sugarcane plantation. The proposal includes total recall of all farm lots presently planted with rice from informal settlers and convert them into a sugarcane plantation. The project partner shall shoulder all expenses for the development and operation and give specific share per hectare. Likewise, it shall extend social services to the workers as secondary beneficiaries of the project.

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Repair of the Technology Building is nearing completion. This is through the supervision of DPWH and the Municipal Engineering Office of Dumangas. Total project cost is Php 250,000.00 sourced from the Congressional Fund of Honorable Ferienel Biron.

Short-term courses on driving, computer literacy, CAD, and many others under the ETC program are continuously gaining the confidence of professionals and out-of-school youth (OSY) and will eventually contribute to the income of the College.

PHYSICAL FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Repair and maintenance of facilities and buildings is the topmost priority of the College utilizing its meager funds from government subsidy and income. Repair of the parapet of the Technology Building with funding from the PDAF of Cong. Biron in the amount of Php 250,000.00 is almost complete.
- Repair and maintenance of comfort rooms, offices and classrooms was given priority during the third quarter of the year using the school improvement development fund (SIDF). Painting of the Administration building was also done. Purchase of plastic chairs, computers and other office supplies was also considered.
- Completion of the repair and maintenance of the Technology and Science buildings was made using College funds. Repair of comfort rooms was also given attention by the Administration.
- The PDMC Parents Teachers Association has started the landscaping project of the frontage of the Technology Building. The association appropriated money for the completion of the project.
- The College Canteen is in full swing giving food and canteen services to the College and high school students.
- The College had officially opened the Dr. Narciso D. Monfort Memorabilia Exhibits at the 2nd floor of the PDMC Congressional Library. Students and faculty from different schools in the province of Iloilo come to visit the place and appreciate the work of one of the great men that Dumangas has produced.
