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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY2013 WVCST ANNUAL REPORT

The College constantly aspires for excellence in the field of science and technology. With this aspiration, WVCST President, Dr. Luis M. Sorolla, Jr., together with the Officer-in-Charge for Academic Affairs and Main Campus Administrator Dr. Manuel A. Sanchez, Jr., the Vice-President for Administration and Finance Dr. Nehema K. Misola and Vice-President for Research and Extension Dr. Carmelo V. Ambut spearheaded the following major accomplishments with the full cooperation of the faculty, staff, students, community leaders and other stakeholders.

INSTRUCTION

GRADUATES

The College has produced a total of 3,074 graduates for the academic year 2012-2013 which increased by 10.46% compared to the previous academic year.

When broken down as to campuses, 51.72% or (1,590) of the graduates were from the main campus; 30.68% or (943), Miag-ao campus (Southern Iloilo Polytechnic College); 7.94% or (244), Dumangas campus (Purification Dolar Monfort College); 6.02% or (185), Leon campus (Leon National College of Agriculture); and 3.64% or (112), Barotac Nuevo campus (Don Jose Sustiguer Monfort Memorial National College). A decrease in the number of graduates was observed from the Leon campus. To help the Leon campus improve its graduation rates, the College is currently working efficiently some strategies.

When clustered by discipline, the bulk of graduates comes from the Engineering and Technology cluster (59.63%), followed by IT-Related disciplines (16.30%) and Education, Science and Teacher Training (15.84%).

ENROLMENT

The College has a total number of 13,027 student enrollees for the first semester, AY 2013-2014 which is 4.76% higher than that of the previous year. When broken down as to campuses, 56.80% or (7,399) were from the main campus; 25.13% or (3,274), Miag-ao campus (SIPC); 5.02% or (654), Dumangas campus (PDMC); 7.52% or (979), Leon campus (LNCA); and 5.53% (721), Barotac Nuevo (DJSMMNC) campus.

During the second semester of the same academic year, a decrease in the number of enrollees was notable. The College enrollment was relatively reduced by 7.91%.

INSTRUCTIONAL ACTIVITIES

To facilitate learning and promote capability enhancement, students were sent to various trainings/seminars/on-the-job (OJT) programs/industry immersions. Thirty-three (33) fourth year Bachelor of Science in Electronics Engineering (BSECE) students and twenty (20) fourth year Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering (BSEE) students had their educational field trip at Manila, Tagaytay and Laguna. The 2GO Travel Agency and WVCST College of Engineering and Architecture (CEA) sponsored the navigational trip of the Bachelor of Science in Marine Engineering (BSMarE) second year students from Sections A to G to Manila, Bacolod and Cagayan de Oro. Ten (10) Bachelor of Industrial Technology (BIT)- Heating, Ventilation and Air-Conditioning-Refrigeration Technology (HVAC-RT) students were deployed to different industries in Manila for their on-the-job training. Furthermore, fourth year Bachelor of Science in Hotel and Restaurant Technology (BSHRT) students had a seminar and Practicum at Amigo Terrace Hotel. The Association of Hotel Restaurant Technology Students (AHRTS) officers are involved in the Livelihood skills training in Food Processing sponsored by Chameleon Incorporated.

Eight (B) students in Diploma in Teaching, one (1) Bachelor of Elementary Education (BEED) and one (1) Bachelor of Secondary Education (BSED) attended the Regional Students' Congress sponsored by PAFTE VI in collaboration cooperation with CHED-Region VI.

The staffers of the college publication of Dumangas campus attended a Seminar-Workshop on Campus Journalism sponsored by the Philippine Information Agency (PIA). Miss Kristine Amar, a third year BIT-Architectural Drafting student, was awarded as the Most Promising News Writer in Filipino during the workshop. Moreover, the second year BSHRT students went on Bar Hopping and attended various seminars.

Seven (7) students of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture (BSA) from Leon campus were deployed to Nagano, Japan. The president of the Student Republic and third year BSED student from Barotac Nuevo campus qualified as delegate to the 15th Ayala Young Leaders Congress (AYCL) 2013.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

The College of Industrial Technology (CIT) reopened the Evening Vocational Courses (EVC) with improved skills training. The evening course is offered to address the volume of students that come and can be completed within 240 hours in one semester. A short term course on entrepreneurial skills known as Entrepreneurial Training Course (ETC) is also offered and runs for B0 hours and with flexible schedule of classes that can be arranged with the instructors. In addition, major revisions in the BSHRT and BIT programs were made through the reduction of units into 1B and number of hours per week into 30. The BIT major in Construction Technology (CT) and Furniture and Cabinetmaking Technology (FCT) faculty prepared course syllabi based on the new format. Instructional materials such as module on Induction Motor Rewinding and training equipment on Pneumatics and Programmable Login Controller were developed to meet the latest trend of industry.

The College of Education (COE) faculty members together with the Registrar and Management Information System (MIS) employees finalized the Bachelor of Science in Industrial Education (BSIE), BEED and BSED curricula to conform to CHED Memorandum Number 30, s. 2004.

The College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) conducted a two-day seminar-workshop on Curriculum Review for the Bachelor of Science in Community Development (BSCD), Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (BSCS), Bachelor of Science in Information Technology (BSIF), Bachelor of Science in Information Systems (BSIS) and Bachelor of Science in Mathematics (BSM) courses. The Natural Sciences faculty also organized skills enhancement and capability building seminars while CEA conducted curriculum review and team building activity.

The Barotac Nuevo campus prepared and enriched the course syllabi of new subjects. Lecture-discussion in academic subjects and laboratory activities in shop were also conducted. The Dumangas campus updated course syllabi and other instructional materials for AACCUP preliminary survey visit.

ACCREDITATION AND CERTIFICATION

The assessment of the BEED, BSED, BSIE, BIT-majors in Fashion and Apparel Technology, Automotive Technology, Electrical Technology and Electronics Technology, Bachelor of Science in Automotive Technology (BSAT), Bachelor of Science in Electrical Technology (BSELT) and Bachelor of Science in Electronics Technology (BSELX) to qualify for Level IV accreditation is still on-going. The Master of Science in Industrial Education (MSIE)-Educational Management, Master of Science in Industrial Education (MSIE) with concentration in Technology Courses, Master of Science in Home Economics (MSHE) and BSCD are now Level III re-accredited. Likewise, BSMath qualified for Level III. The Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) major in Educational Management in Level II accredited. The Bachelor of Science in Architecture (BSA), Bachelor of Science in Electronics Engineering (BSECE), Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering (BSEE), BSIF, BSCS, BSMarE, BSHRT and Bachelor in Fashion and Apparel Technology (BFAT) are Level I accredited. Furthermore, the Doctor of Industrial Technology (DIT), Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering (BSMEAE), BSIS and MIT are in Candidate Status.

The BSED program of Miag-ao campus is Level II reaccredited. Its BSIF, BIT, BSHRT, BSELX, BSAT and BSELT programs are Level I Accredited while its BEED in Candidate Status.

Two programs of Dumangas Campus were awarded candidate status. These are BSIT and BSHRT programs. The BSA of Leon campus is also in Candidate Status.

For Barotac Nuevo campus, the BSED and BSIF are Level I accredited while the BSHRT and BSIT programs are in Candidate Status.

RESEARCH

RESEARCHES

The College faculty members and staff have forty-eight (48) completed researches and forty-eight (48) on-going researches and projects. These researches were accomplished by one hundred ninety-one (191) faculty and staff researchers. The Miag-ao campus published the Volume 7 of its institutional research journal containing faculty researches from November 2012-October 2013. The College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) published research compendium, a compilation of research abstracts conducted by the students.

When broken down as to campuses, twenty-six (26) researches were completed by the faculty and staff from the main campus, three (3) from the Leon campus, two (2) Barotac Nuevo campus, fifteen (15) Miag-ao campus and two (2) Dumangas campus.

The College faculty researchers and staff actively disseminated their results through publication in reputable journals and paper presentations in national and international fora and conferences.

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

The Western Visayas College of Science and Technology was one of the six (6) universities visited by the International Intellectual Property Institute (IIPI) on April 12, 2013. The other universities visited were: (1) Bicol University (2) De La Salle University (3) University of San Carlos (4) University of Sto. Tomas and (5) University of Southeastern Philippines. During the IIPI's visit to WVCST, the experts met the WVCST-Innovation and Technology Support Office (ITSO) representatives and members of the government agencies, local government and business people especially those involved in encouraging creativity, innovation, entrepreneurship, product development and commercialization. The IIPI experts consist of four (4) members: Mr. Andrew Jaynes, Executive Director and General Counsel of IIPI; Dr. Richard "Dick" Cahoon from Cornell University; Dr. Stanley Kowalski from University of New Hampshire Law School and Mr. Jason Nickla from University of Nebraska Medical Center. Mr. Jaynes and Mr. Nickla were the ones assigned to visit WVCST. Likewise, Dr. Cahoon, President of the BioProperty Strategy Group Inc., also visited WVCST to conduct individual training session on IP Commercialization.

The WVCST Innovation and Technology Support Office (ITSO) continues to provide IP services to Region VI. Activities are undertaken to enhance the technical and capability of its staff. Ms. Lavinia Dulla successfully completed her on-the-job (OJT) training on patent information search at Patent Monitoring Division (PatMD) of the Documentation, Information and Technology Transfer Bureau (DITTB) of Intellectual Property of the Philippines last May 14-27, 2013. Dr. Carmelo Ambut was invited as a speaker on Patent Drafting training at Capiz State University last October 28-29, 2013. In addition, the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHL), in cooperation with the LexisNexis, conducted the "User Training for the Total Patents Solution" for ITSO participants last October 9, 2013 at WVCST L-8 Building of Commission Information Communication Technology (CICT), Laboratory School. Mr. Nicholas Khoo and Ms. Kiyomi Mori, experts from LexisNexis, conducted the training.

The Research Services Division (RSD) encourages the teachers and staff members to write books and other instructional materials to increase the intellectual properties of the College. Five (5) instructional materials received copyrights in August and April 2013. The Miag-ao campus also developed six (6) instructional materials.

Dr. Leonardo S. Sotaridona, a former faculty of WVCST and presently working abroad under the Measurement Incorporated as psychometrian, delivered a symposium on (a) How to get accepted into local and international conference starting from selection of topic, preparation of paper presentation; (b) Overview of cheating detection methodology; and (c) Recent Advances in Education and psychological measurement. The Research Office conducted the said event last October 8, 2013 at the WVCST Boardroom.

The RSD through its different centers conducted in-house/technical reviews and administrative reviews to produce quality researches for AY 2013-2014. The Miag-ao campus held a Research Colloquium as part of the two-day activity of the Annual Planning Workshop of College. Also, Miag-ao campus conducted In-house review where faculty researchers presented ten (10) papers for review and critiquing by a group panelist. The Dumangas campus conducted Needs Assessment Survey for Technology transfer at P.D. Monfort South, Dumangas Iloilo. In addition, Dumangas campus conducted a Lecture-Workshop on the preparation of Concept paper and research proposal.

Other faculty and staff researchers were also sent to various international, national, regional and local conventions/conferences/seminars which could be an avenue for obtaining new knowledge and the sharing of research practices. Some of these were the Regional Research Symposium for faculty and students organized by PASUC VI, the regional and national conventions on statistics, International Conference on Higher Education Research, International Research Scholars Conference and many others.

INVENTIONS AND INNOVATIONS

The College submitted five (S) patent, utility model and trademark applications for registration. One (1) was granted utility model registration. Another four (4) patent applications are still on Substantive Examination (Phase II).

One (1) more utility model application for physics apparatus was forwarded to IPOPHil for registration.

Several inventions of the faculty researchers are now on production and for sale. These are the following: Valve Spring Remover with Seal Puller of Prof. Jogie Cubar, the Folding Tailor's Square of Prof. Lino Baldevarona, Electronic Water Level Controller of Mr. Julius Catalan, Dr. Renerio Mucas and Dr. Antonio Derequito, physics apparatus of the PULSaR team, and Anti-pest electronics gadget of the Robotics Team.

AWARDS

Dr. Luis M. Sorolla, Jr. received an award for Outstanding Contribution to Education during the World Education Congress at Mumbai, India on June 28, 2013.

In the 2nd PASUC VI Regional Research Symposium for Faculty Researchers, the WVCST entry Confidence Index Construct: Evidence from Philippine Basketball Players of Prof. Grace Edmar Elizar del Prado was declared 3rd place winner.

During the National Research Conference of West Visayas State University, Calinog Campus at Punta Villa Resort Iloilo City, the WVCST research papers won awards. The research of Prof. Mirvelene Lauz entitled: "A Survey of the National Achievement Test in English among Grade VI Pupils in the DepEd-Division of Iloilo City: A Basis for WVCST Extension Program" won 3rd place. Prof. Grace del Prado's research entitled: "Behavioral Patterns of Personal Consumption Expenditures in the Philippines" won 1st place and 3rd place best paper presenter.

The research output presentations of Misses Lavinia B. Dulla and Andrea B. Pama were well-appreciated by the participants from other countries during the 1st International Research Scholars Conference at Asia-Pacific International University, Saraburi, Muak Lek, Thailand.

Dr. Carmelo V. Ambut, Vice President for Research and Extension, was awarded by the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippine as Ulirang Guro ng ITSO (Innovation and Technology Support Office).

EXTENSION

The College extended support to the community through its various extension programs. These are in the forms of community organizations, education, socio-economic programs, health and nutrition, environmental, and other social services accompanied by monitoring and evaluation. Through the Extension Services Division (ESD), the College has a total of 111 extension activities/projects.

When broken down as to campuses, sixty-seven (67) various extension programs were undertaken by the main campus, five (5) by the Leon campus, eleven (11) Barotac Nuevo campus, seventeen (17) Dumangas campus and eleven (11) Miag-ao campus.

The College ESD received several certificates of appreciation, participation and recognition from various agencies such as the A. Mirasol Memorial School, Graciano Lopez Jaena Elementary School, Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office, Educational Research and Development Assistance (ERDA) Foundation, Inc., Office of the Ombudsman (Visayas) Regional Office, Department of Social Welfare and Development Field Office VI, Bakhaw Elementary School, Taal Elementary School, NJ Ingore Elementary School, Municipality of Oton and PASUC VI Extension Managers Council, Inc.

Competent personnel also offered expert services in their capacities as resource persons/speakers, TESDA competency assessors, thesis and dissertation advisers, judges, accreditors, sports coaches/officials, documenters and consultants.

PRODUCTION

The main campus generated Php 18,489,808.67 from its income-generating projects such as <u>Futtu Kaffe</u>, Copy Shoppe, Salon and Wellness Spa, Cafeteria, Nutrition center canteen, STO canteen, Mini hotel, Guiang Hostel, trophy, furniture, space rental, instructional materials, academic collar, logo and Physical Education uniforms.

The Barotac Nuevo campus generated Php 62,860 from its bakery, canteen, BSED mini-mart, rental and catering services.

On the other hand, the PDMC-Dumangas campus has generated Php 237,025.00 from its sound system, sale of Bangus (PDMC fishpond in Anilao) and rentals.

For 2013, Leon campus generated Php 219,671.05 from agricultural production (animal and crops), college canteen, rentals of facilities and spaces. It continues with their IGPs such as piggery, broiler production, carabao, coconut, rice, corn, vegetables/fruits, banana, mango, nursery, cut flower, seedlings, greenhouse (production of vegetables), commercialization of vermin composting project, sales of newspapers/firewood/scrap materials, rentals of equipment/facilities and canteen. The campus received the following donations: one (1) Balikbayan box containing references, magazines, journals, office and school supplies and other stuffs from LNCA alumni, Leon residents and benefactors based in the USA; references and magazines from SEANAFE/PAFERN; references and books from SEAMEO-RECSAM in Malaysia; magazines and newsletter from WAC/ICRAF; newsletter from DABAR; and references on rice and magazines from PHILRICE.

The SIPC-Miag-ao campus generated Php 776,026.50 from its IGPs derived from the cafeteria, bakeshop, rentals of facilities and spaces and instructional materials.

PHYSICAL FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT

The WVCST Board of Trustees approved the construction of a three-storey HOMETEL (Technology and Livelihood Education (center)-Phase 1. The constructions of the Hotel and Restaurant Technology (HRT) Service Center and College Library were completed projects. The repair of the Teacher's Education Building and administration building facades with covered walkway, repair of perimeter fence, installation of fire protection system at HRT service center, guard rails and library landscaping are also some of the completed infrastructure projects. On-going projects are College of Engineering and Architecture/Information and Communication Technology building and three-storey HOMETEL (TLE center).

The Dumangas campus repaired its computer and HRT laboratories, classrooms in Academic building, Administration building. The fabrication and installation of grills at the Student center were also completed as well as in the College entrance gate. Function room and comfort rooms to access PWDs have also been renovated. Construction of concrete ramps with handrails was also completed.

The Leon campus completed the constructions of its nursery, canteen expansion, steel bridge, ceiling of classrooms, librarian's office, floor tilling, staff house, concrete benches and tables with cemented flooring, material recovery facility, cabinets for library and offices, recreation center, long tables, window grills at Science Laboratory building and septic tank. Repairs were done for the comfort rooms, nursery lecture/demo room, clonal chamber, teacher's cottage and drainage canal. The canteen was also repaired and painted. In addition, fire alarm system and CCTV cameras were installed.

The Miag-ao campus completed the construction of its Information Technology Extension and student activity area. Fabrication of new laboratory table, six units of new teachers' tables, three units work stations at the Registrar's office and one unit biometric cabinet were complete and 77 units of drawing tables were repaired and repainted. In addition, the concreting of pathway of building H is already completed.

The Barotac campus completed the construction of its science laboratory, tables, wash area, medicine cabinets, fitting room and dresser for cosmetology, office cabinet and pigeon hole. Furthermore, roofing of the administration building and Bachelor of Information Technology laboratory room were repaired. The fixed glass of door and windows of BSED laboratory room and perimeter fencing were completed.

Figure 1. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2012-2013




Figure 3. Distribution of Enrolment by Cluster of Discipline and by Semester, AY 2013-2014




Figure 5. Distribution of Personnel as to their Employment Status, CY 2013




Figure 6. Distribution of Personnel as to their Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2013







Figure 7. Distribution of Library Materials by Department



Figure 8. Distribution of Library Attendance by Department




Figure 10. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2012-2013




Figure 12. Distribution of Enrolment per Semester by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2013-2014



Figure 13. Distribution of Personnel by Employment Status, CY 2013




Figure 14. Distribution of Personnel by Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2013



Figure 15. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2012-2013




Figure 17. Distribution of Enrolment per Semester by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2013-2014 2nd Semester



Figure 18. Distribution of Personnel by Employment Status, CY 2013




Figure 19. Distribution of Personnel by Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2013



Figure 20. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2012-2013






Figure 23. Distribution of Personnel by Employment Status, CY 2013




Figure 24. Distribution of Personnel by Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2013



Figure 25. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2012-2013




Figure 27. Distribution of Enrolment by Cluster of Discipline and by Semester, AY 2013-2014



Figure 28. Distribution of Personnel by Employment Status, CY 2013




Figure 29. Distribution of Personnel Profile by Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2013


