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# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

## **2012 WVCST ANNUAL REPORT**

The College continuously aspires for excellence in the field of science and technology. With this aspiration, WVCST President Dr. Luis M. Sorolla, Jr., together with the Officer-in-Charge for Academic Affairs Dr. Emma L. Paclibar and the Officer-in-Charge for Administration and Finance Dr. Nehema K. Misola spearheaded the following major accomplishments with the full cooperation of the faculty, staff, students, community leaders and other stakeholders.

### **INSTRUCTION**

#### **GRADUATES**

The College has produced a total of 2,783 graduates for the academic year 2011-2012 which is considerably lower by 3.87% from the previous academic year. This is the third year that the College observed a decrease in the number of graduates.

When broken down as to campuses, 49.30% (1,372) of the graduates were from the main campus, 31.84% (886) were from the Miag-ao campus (Southern Iloilo Polytechnic College), 6.90% (192) were from the Dumangas campus (Purificacion Dolar Monfort College), 8.30% (231) were from the Leon campus (Leon National College of Agriculture) and 3.67% (102) were from the Barotac Nuevo campus (Don Jose Sustiguer Monfort Memorial National College). The decrease in the number of graduates was observed in the Miag-ao, Dumangas and Barotac Nuevo campuses. To help the campuses improve their graduation rates, the College is currently working on some strategies.

When clustered by discipline, the bulk of graduates belongs to the engineering and technology cluster (54.94%) followed by the IT-related disciplines (18.15%), and education and teacher training (17.43%).

#### **ENROLMENT**

The College has a total number of 12,435 student enrollees for the first semester, AY 2012-2013 which is 7.31% higher than that of the previous year. When broken down as to campuses, 59.42% (7,389) were from the main campus, 23.00% (2,860) were from the Miag-ao campus, (SIPC) 4.80% (597) were from the Dumangas campus (PDMC), 7.37% (916) were from the Leon campus (LNCA), and 5.41% (673) were from the Barotac Nuevo (DJSMMNC) campus.

During the second semester of the same academic year, a decrease in the number of enrollees was notable. The College enrollment was relatively reduced by 8.15%.

## INSTRUCTIONAL ACTIVITIES

To facilitate learning and promote capability-enhancement, students were sent to various trainings/seminars/on-the-job (OJT) programs/industry immersions. Ten (10) B.S. Electrical Engineering students attended the IIEE of the Philippines, Inc. Region VI IIEE Western Visayas Regional Conference at La Carmela de Boracay, Aklan. The fourth year B.S. in Hotel and Restaurant Technology students had shipboard training via Superferry and Negros Navigation. Seven (7) third year BIT Mechanical Technology students had their OJT in Tri R Industries at Cavite City. Furthermore, one (1) B.S. Information Technology student and one (1) B.S. Community Development student attended the **National Youth Gathering** at the Lay Formation Center, Dagupan City, Pangasinan with the theme **Me to We: Empowering Youth through Global Citizenship Education**.

Michael Garlan, a fourth year B.S. Secondary Education student, was the Philippines' **2012 International Bayer Young Environmental Envoy** to Germany.

The 6<sup>th</sup> batch of trainees from the Leon campus went to Hokkaido, Japan for agricultural training. The first and second year students of the Bachelor in Computer Technology and B.S. Information Technology from the Barotac Nuevo campus had an industry orientation at Cebu City.

## CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

The College of Industrial Technology implemented the new revised curricula to the first year students. A newly developed course coding/listing of subjects was included in the **College Almanac** and is being implemented this first semester. The College produced instructional materials and devices for the shop subjects. The Electrical; and Heating, Ventilation and Air-Conditioning-Refrigeration Technology (HVAC-RT) Departments upgraded their B.S. Electrical Technology, BIT Electrical Technology and HVAC-RT curricula. The Auto-Mechanical Department revised its course syllabi for the implementation of new subjects. Furthermore, drafting subjects to be included in the **College Almanac** were comprehensively reviewed.

The College of Arts and Sciences revised the syllabus per subject area as suggested by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO).

The Dumangas campus established a partnership with Isuzu Iloilo in the development of its Automotive Technology program. One of the benefits of the partnership is the granting of field parts for instructional use, OJT of students and even faculty members, industry or field visit and other available opportunities. As of this time, the field parts taken from the latest model cars of Isuzu were already delivered to the College for identification by students in their shop activities. Moreover, the College has actively participated in the review and finalization of the **College Almanac** for approval by the Board of Trustees.

The Barotac Nuevo campus prepared and enriched the course syllabi for new subjects. Course outlines and other documents were updated for CHED evaluation.

## ACCREDITATION AND CERTIFICATION

The assessment of the Bachelor of Elementary Education; Bachelor of Secondary Education; Bachelor of Industrial Education; Bachelors of Industrial Technology majors in Fashion and Apparel Technology, Automotive Technology, Electrical Technology and Electronics Technology to qualify for Level IV accreditation is still on-going.

The College of Arts and Sciences is preparing for the incoming accreditation of M.S. Computer Science, M.A. Mathematics and B.S. Information Systems in February or March 2013.

The Dumangas campus is scheduled to have the Preliminary Survey Visit of its three programs namely the B.S. Hotel and Restaurant Technology, B.S. Information Technology, and Bachelor of Industrial Technology in April 2013. As preparation, one faculty was sent to attend the **AACUP Accreditors' Training Seminar**. Selected faculty and staff also attended an **Orientation Seminar on the Preliminary Survey Visit** at SIPC - WVCST, Miag-ao, Iloilo. The CHED Monitoring Team conducted an assessment of the programs of the College. Its evaluation was made as the basis for the College to make some curricular revisions.

## RESEARCH

### RESEARCHES

The College faculty members has fifty-one (51) completed researches and sixty-three (63) on-going researches and projects. These researches were accomplished by eighty-two (82) faculty researchers. The Miag-ao campus published the **Institutional Research Journal Volume 6** containing faculty research results from November 2011-October 2012. It published a **Research Compendium**, a compilation of abstracts of researches conducted by the faculty, staff and students.

When broken down as to campuses, seventeen (17) faculty researches were from the main campus, twenty-seven (27) were from the Leon campus, one (1) was from the Barotac Nuevo campus and six (6) were from the Miag-ao campus.

The College faculty researchers actively disseminated their results through publication in reputable journals and paper presentations in national and international fora and conferences.

### RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

The Western Visayas College of Science and Technology hosted a patent-related national workshop on 21 May 2012. In preparation for the **Competition on Innovative Solutions for Everyday Life** in June 2012, an orientation was held at the Computer Room of the Engineering Building. The resource persons were Mr. Lutz Mailander, head of the Patent Information Section and Mr. Insun Choi of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), and Dr. Dong Kuk Kim of the Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO). Present to welcome the guests and participants was Atty. Ricardo Blancaflor, Director-General of the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines

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(IPOPPhil). Two inventions were shortlisted as among the 23 entries to the WIPO-KIPO competition on **Innovative Solutions for Everyday Life** - the water-driven turbine pump by Engrs. Salvador Senioro and Quirino Jamilarin, and the mini-biodiesel plant by Engr. Godofredo Defensor and Drs. Rolando Jacuman and Richard De Leon.

The WVCST Innovation and Technology Support Office (ITSO) continues to provide IP services to Region 6. Activities are undertaken to enhance the technical and capability of its staff. Dr. Richard De Leon and Ms. Lavinia Dulla enrolled in the **WIPO DL 301- Advanced Course on Patents, DL 318- Patent Information Search** and **DL 320-Basics of Patent Drafting**. They passed the **WIPO DL 318-Patent Information Search** and **DL 320-Basics of Patent Drafting** while result on the **DL 301-Advanced Course on Patents** has not been released yet by WIPO. Dr. Carmelo Ambut enrolled in the **WIPO DL 450-Advanced Course on Intellectual Property Management**. The ITSO network is composed of 31 universities and non-academic institutions whose personnel are well-grounded in providing IP services. The ITSOs were officially launched during the **High-Level Forum on Access to Technology for Innovation** last 22-23 March 2012 at The Peninsula Manila, Makati City with Dr. Francis Gurry, Director - General of WIPO gracing the event. Present were Drs. Luis Sorolla, Jr. and Carmelo Ambut, and Misses Lavinia Dulla and Bethel Bacabac. In addition, RSD conducted the **Forum on Intellectual Property (IP) Management**. Participants from various WVCST campuses listened to Drs. Dong Kuk Kim, Carmelo Ambut and Richard de Leon, and Miss Lavinia Dulla discuss prior art, novelty, inventive step and IP management. Furthermore, Dr. Carmelo Ambut was invited as resource speaker during the forum on **Intellectual Property (IP) Awareness** and the **Development of IP Policies** at Colegio de San Agustin, Bacolod City.

RSD has distributed the fourth and fifth issues of its newsletter. **Module in Planning** by Dr. Carmelo Ambut and **Laboratory Manual in Industrial Electronics for ECE and EE** by Dr. Gabriel Salistre, Jr., received copyrights in January 2012. The Miag-ao campus also developed six (6) instructional materials. RSD encourages the teachers and staff members to write books and other instructional materials to increase the intellectual properties of the College.

Fifteen (15) anti-pest electronic gadgets were submitted to the RSD by the Robotics Team. Using ultrasonics, the second-generation designs have self-adjusting frequencies that repel not only mosquitoes but other pests like rats. The design incorporated frequency change to repel them. RSD plans to test the products for acceptability. Samples were submitted to the following persons for comments: Senator Edgardo Angara, CHED Commissioner Nenalyn Defensor, DOST Region 6 Director Rowen Gelonga, and Mr. Edgar Javison, DBM budget specialist.

RSD through its different centers conducted in-house/technical and administrative reviews for AY 2012-2013. The Miag-ao campus held a **Research Paper Presentation and In-House Review** in which three (3) completed research papers and four (4) research proposals were presented.

An exploratory talk on research collaboration was held in the RSD office last 10 January 2012. Dr. Paulito Palmes, a computer scientist, discussed prospective joint R & D projects with Dr. Carmelo Ambut and some engineering and science faculty members. Ms. Andrea Panilla of DOST Region 6 gave an overview of the Balik Scientist program and Dr. Palmes' resume. The roundtable discussion included topics in artificial intelligence, robotics and bioinformatics.

Dr. Carmelo Ambut and Prof. Belinda Zamora visited Dr. Henry Ramos, Director of Research and Development of UP Diliman to have an exploratory talk on future collaborations in frontier science and leading- edge technology.

Other faculty and staff researchers were sent to various local, regional, national, and conventions/conferences/seminars. Some of these were the **Regional Research Symposium** for faculty and students organized by PASUC VI, the regional and national conventions on statistics, and the **International Conference on Higher Education Research**.

## INVENTIONS AND INNOVATIONS

The College submitted twenty (20) patent and utility model applications for registration. Four (4) were granted utility model registrations and one (1) patent by IPOPhil. The **Rubber Presser** by Dr. Luis M. Sorolla, Jr. received the first patent certificate for WVCST. Another four (4) patent applications were on Substantive Examination (Phase II).

Two (2) more utility model applications for physics instruments were forwarded to IPOPhil for registration.

Several inventions of the faculty researchers are ready for commercialization. For sale are the following: valve spring remover with seal puller of Mr. Jogie Cubar; the folding tailor's square of Prof. Lino Baldevarona; electronic water-level controller of Prof. Julius Catalan, Drs. Renerio Mucas and Antonio Derequito; physics instruments of the PULSaR team; and the anti-pest electronics gadgets of the Robotics Team.

## AWARDS

Ms. May Sansait, a science faculty member of SIPC-WVCST, Miag-ao earned awards in two local research fora. Her paper **The Floristics and Community Structure of Mangroves in Antique Province, Panay Island, Philippines** was declared **Best Paper: Natural/Environmental Science Category** during the **1st PASUC 6 Regional Research Symposium for Theses and Dissertations**. The same paper garnered the **Best Poster Award** during the **4th UPV Graduate Research Conference**.

In the **3<sup>rd</sup> PASUC Regional Student Research Symposium**, the WVCST entry **Bluetooth Audio/Amplifier** was declared first-prize winner. The gadget provides an instant audio output to Bluetooth devices like laptops, computers and other devices with Bluetooth technology. The proponents of the winning entry were Hernan Anthony Dajao, Adah Asenjo and Joseph Alvin Pajadura. Engr. Santos James Emmanuel Malunda served as adviser.

During the **Global Conference on Education, Business, Engineering and Sciences (GCEBES) 2012** at the Marina Bay Sands Expo and Convention Centre, Singapore, WVCST research papers won awards: **Development of the Quality of Life Index of Students in the Campus: An Alternative Measure for Quality Higher Education** by Prof. Grace Edmar Elizar del Prado-first place, **Gonad Rematuration and Reproductive Cycle of the Mud Clam, Anodontia edentula in Guimaras, Central Philippines** by Mrs. Milessa Argañoza-first place, and **Context-Based Mathematics Problem-Solving: Cognitive and Affective Effects on the BIT and BS Voc Tech Students** by Dr. Arlene Hortillosa-second place. Mr. Joselito Trandio Mendoza's **Preliminary Assessment on the Floristic Composition of Tamban Hill, Maasin, Iloilo, Philippines and Its Implications for Ecotourism Development** and Ms. Doly Joy Camariosa's **Hemispheric Brain**

**Dominance and Mathematics Performance of Western Visayas College of Science and Technology Students** both won third place during the **World Research Festival 2012** at Marco Polo Plaza, Cebu City. Their papers also won second place during the **Training Workshop on Enabling Policies, Programs and Best Practices in Research and Publication in Compliance to CHED's Typology in Higher Education**. In the same event, Mr. Jasper Pastrano's **ICT-Based Lessons: Their Effects on the Conceptual Understanding of Students in Physics** won second place.

## EXTENSION

The College extended support to the community through its various extension programs in the forms of community organizations, education, socio-economic programs, health and nutrition, environmental, and other services accompanied by monitoring and evaluation. Through the Extension Services Division (ESD), the College has a total of 118 extension activities/projects.

When broken down as to campuses, seventy-three (73) of various extension programs were undertaken by the main campus, five (5) by the Leon campus, six (6) by the Barotac Nuevo campus, thirteen (13) by the Dumangas campus and twenty-one (21) by the Miag-ao campus.

The College ESD received several certificates of appreciation, participation and recognition from various agencies such as the Department of Environment and Natural Resources Community, Environment and Natural Resources Office, Educational Research and Development Assistance (ERDA) Foundation, Inc., Chameleon Association, Jollibee Group Foundation, Uygongco Foundation, Inc., Barangay Hinactacan, A. Mirasol Memorial School, Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office, Philippine Red Cross, BJMP Region VI, Iloilo City District, PASUC-EMC, Inc., Eugenio J. Hobilla Memorial Elementary School, Municipality of Igbaras, and La Paz Elementary School.

Competent personnel also offered expert services in their capacities as resource persons/speakers, TESDA competency assessors, thesis and dissertation advisers, judges, accreditors, sports coaches/officials, documenters, and consultants.

## PRODUCTION

The main campus has generated Php 10,801,231.96 from its income-generating projects such as the Futto Kaffe, Copy Shoppe, Pasalubong Center/IM, P.E. uniforms, Salon and Wellness Spa, cafeteria, Nutrition Center canteen, STO canteen, mini-hotel, Guiang Hostel, trophies, furniture, and space rentals.

The Barotac Nuevo campus has generated Php 72,862. from its bakery, canteen, BSEd mini-mart, Internet cafe, test booklets, garments, rentals, and catering services.

PDMC, the Dumangas campus, has generated Php 23,817.02 from its canteen, sound system, rentals and sale of firewood. Income was also obtained from short-term courses on driving, computer literacy, CAD and many others under the ETC program because these are continuously gaining the confidence of professionals and out-of-school youth (OSY).

The Leon campus continues to have various IGP's such as piggery; production from rice, corn, vegetables; rentals of equipment/facilities; sale of newspapers/firewood/scrap materials, mangoes, bananas, nursery soybeans, cutflowers, seedlings, greenhouse vegetables, coconuts, carabaos and commercialization of vermin compost. In addition, the campus generated Php 295,250.00 from its agricultural production (animals and crops), canteen, and rentals of facilities and spaces. The campus has received the following donations: three (3) Balikbayan boxes which contained references, magazines, journals, office and school supplies and other materials for the LNCA populace from US benefactors; references and magazines from SEANAFE/PAFERN; rain gauge from SEAMEO-RECSAM in Malaysia; magazines and newsletters from WAC/ICRAF; newsletters from DABAR, and references on rice from PHILRICE.

SIPC, the Miag-ao campus, generated Php 460,114 from its IGP's such as the cafeteria, bakeshop, rental of facilities and spaces, and instructional materials.

## PHYSICAL FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT

The WVCST Board of Trustees approved the construction of the College of Engineering and Architecture/Information and Communication Technology building. The academic urn, PE activity area, ATM center, exit way and new boardroom are some of the completed infrastructure projects.

The Dumangas campus repair and maintenance of comfort rooms, offices and classrooms were given priority during first quarter of the year using the SIDF. The painting of the Administration Building was also done as well as the purchase of plastic chairs, computers and other office supplies. The repair and maintenance of the Technology and Science buildings were made using College funds. The construction of a gazebo in cooperation with the PDMC PTA and Student Government is already completed. Moreover, the PDMC PTA has completed the landscaping project in front of the Technology Building. The maintenance of the **Dr. Narciso D. Monfort Memorabilia Exhibits** at the second floor of the PDMC Congressional Library continues. Students and faculty from different schools in Iloilo visit the place and appreciate the work of one of the great men of Dumangas. The Automotive Technology Building and pathway have also been repaired.

LNCA completed the painting and repainting of buildings and other structures. The flooring of the Audio-Visual Room, pig pens, partition of the pre-fab building 1, nursery for indigenous species of trees, poultry house for broiler and layer production and the expansion of the canteen was completed. Glass windows and air-conditioning units were installed in the Audio-Visual Room and the computer laboratory room. Also, the construction of the covered footwalk to the Science Building, Student Center and medical-dental clinic was completed.

The Miag-ao campus finished constructing the HVAC-RT/WAFT laboratory with a budget of Php 910,809.98 and the second phase of the Student Center. Minor repairs of school buildings were done and cabinets and working tables for laboratory rooms were fabricated.

DJSMMNC completed the renovation and construction of the cabinets for the medical and dental clinics. In addition, repair of damaged long tables of different classrooms and laboratory rooms was done.

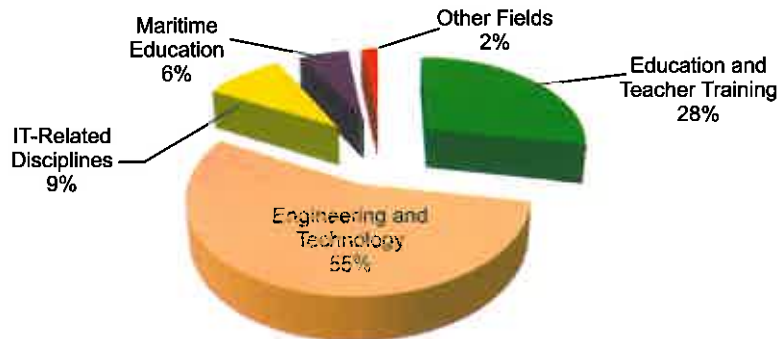

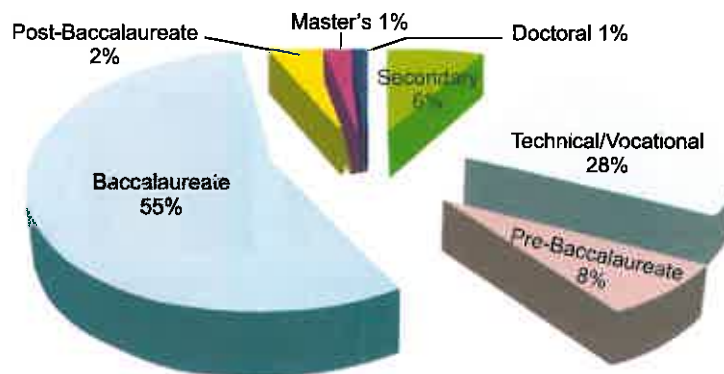
*Figure 1. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2011-2012*

Figure 3. Distribution of Enrolment by Cluster of Discipline and by Semester, AY 2012-2013

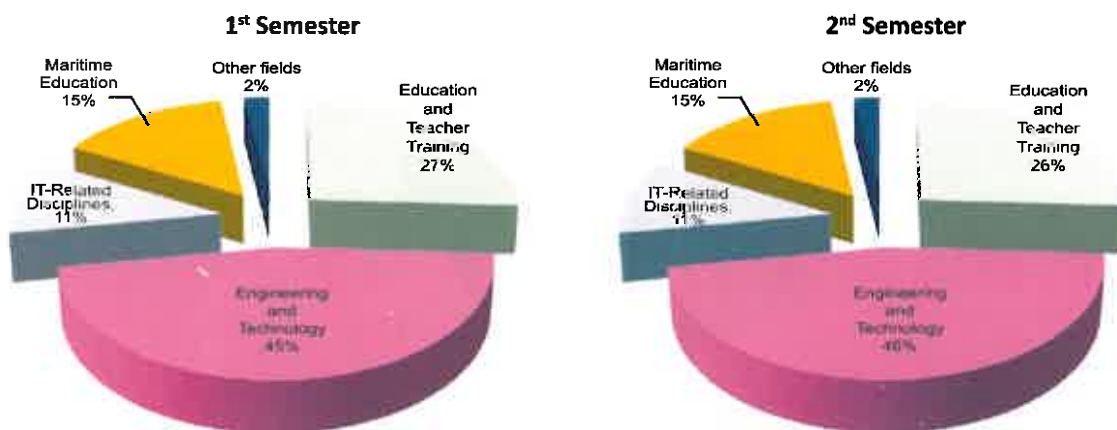


Figure 4. Comparative Enrolment by Cluster of Discipline and by Semester, AY 2012-2013

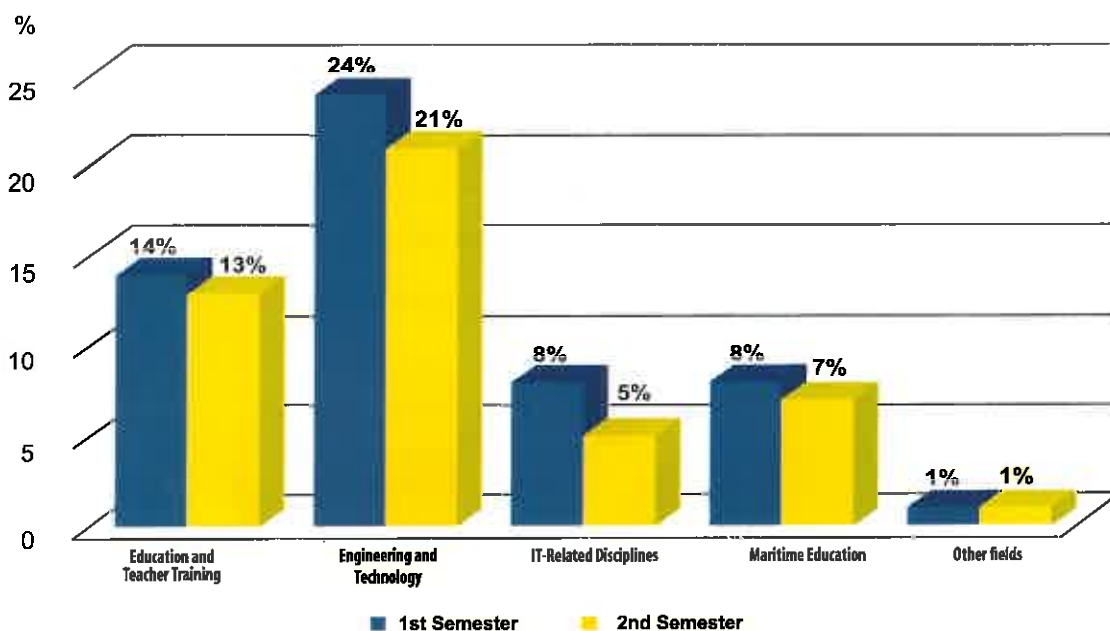

Figure 5. Distribution of Enrolment by Program Level and by Semester, AY 2012-2013

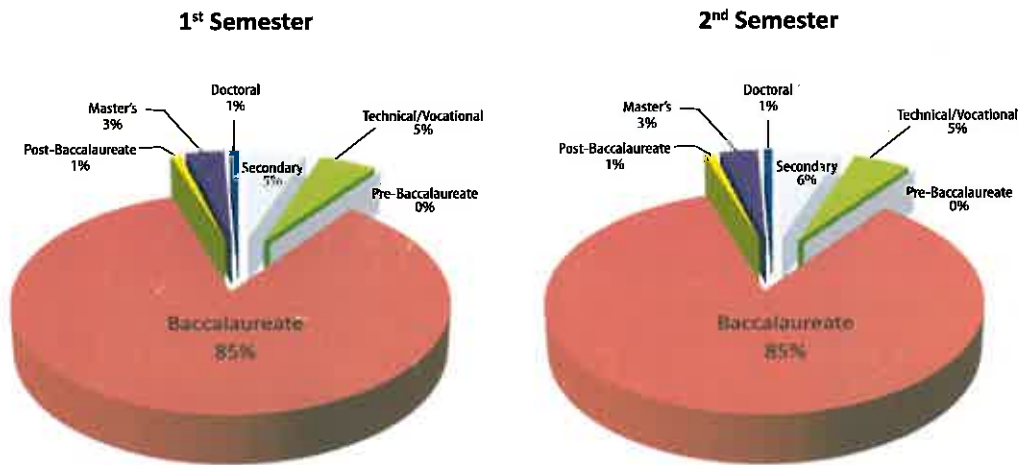
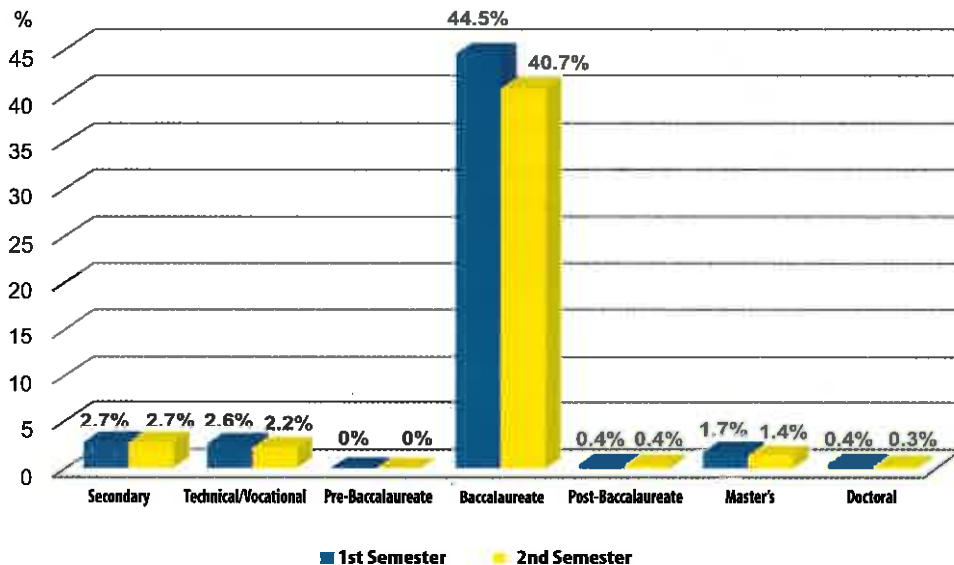


Figure 6. Comparative Enrolment by Program Level and by Semester, AY 2012-2013

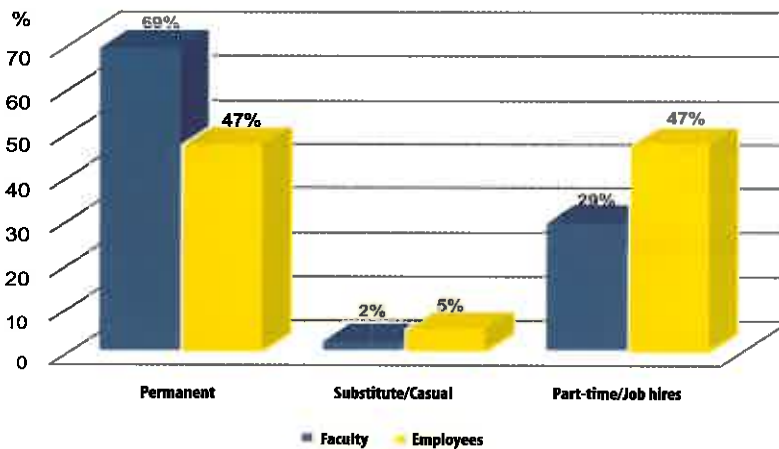

*Figure 8. Distribution of Faculty as to Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2012*

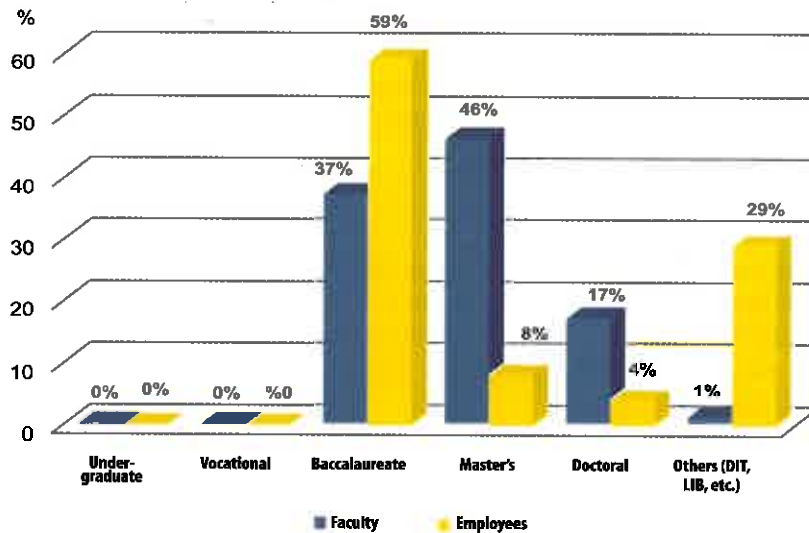

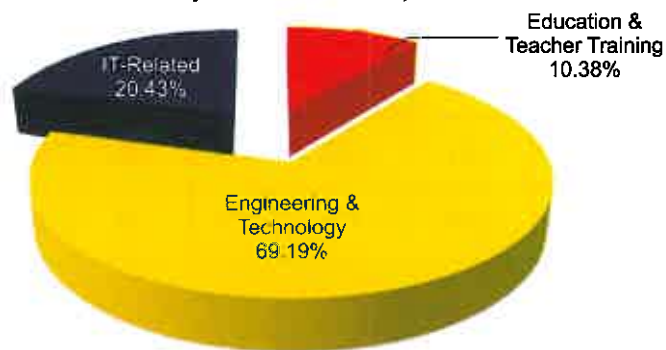

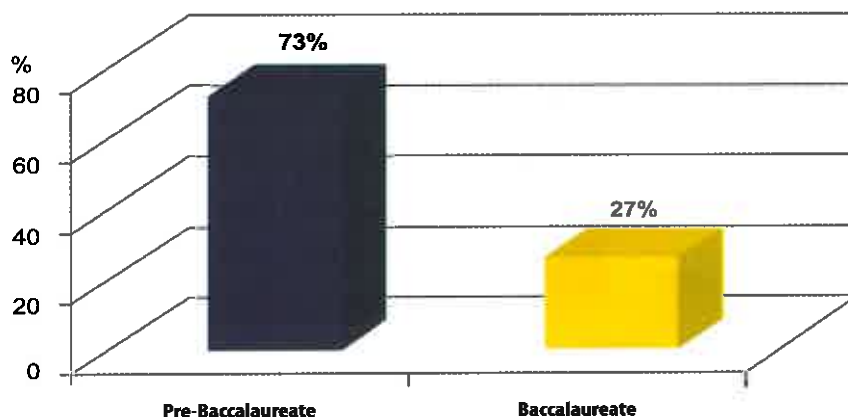
*Figure 10. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2011-2012*

*Figure 11. Distribution of Graduates by Program Level, AY 2011-2012*

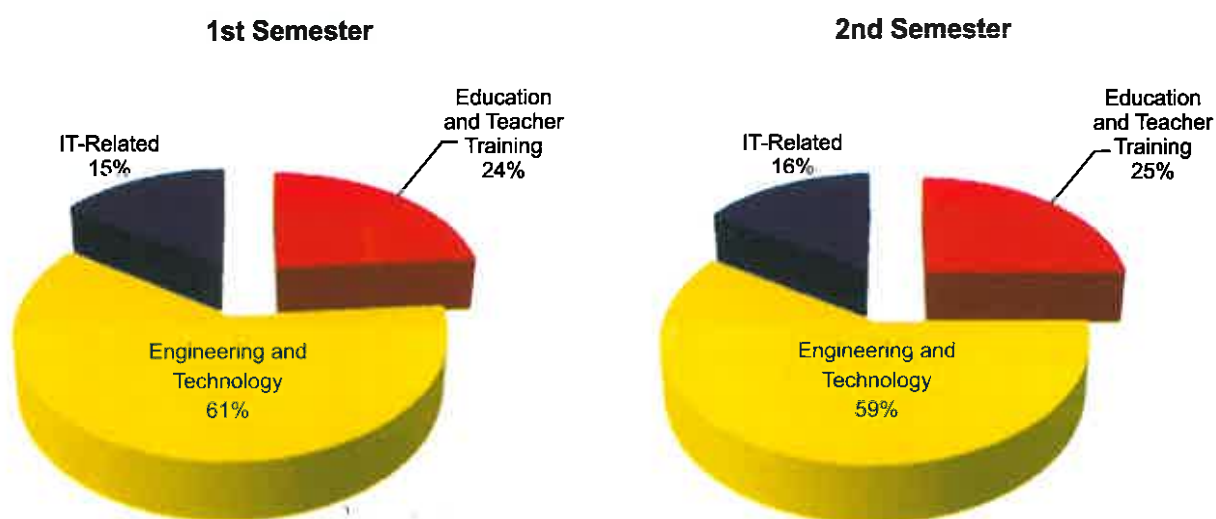

Figure 13. Distribution of Personnel by Employment Status, CY 2012

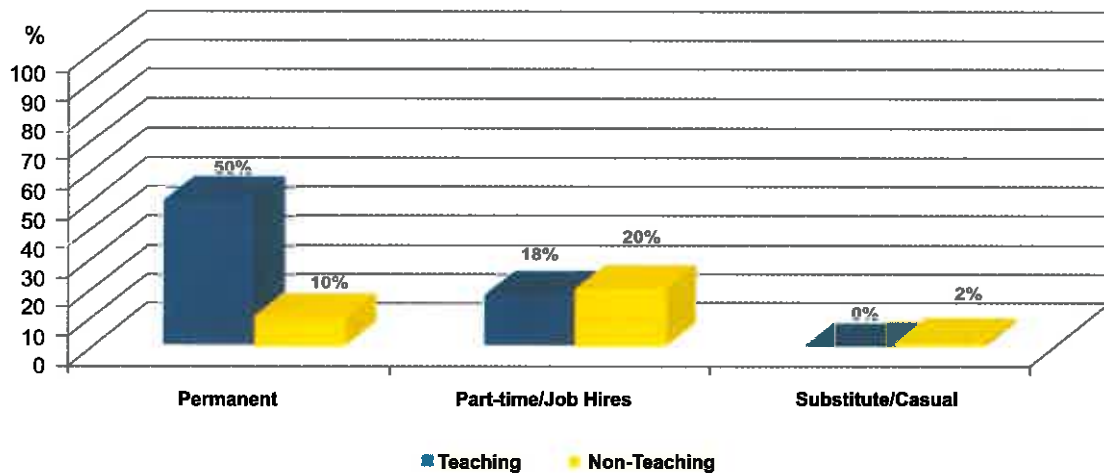


Figure 14. Distribution of Personnel by Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2012

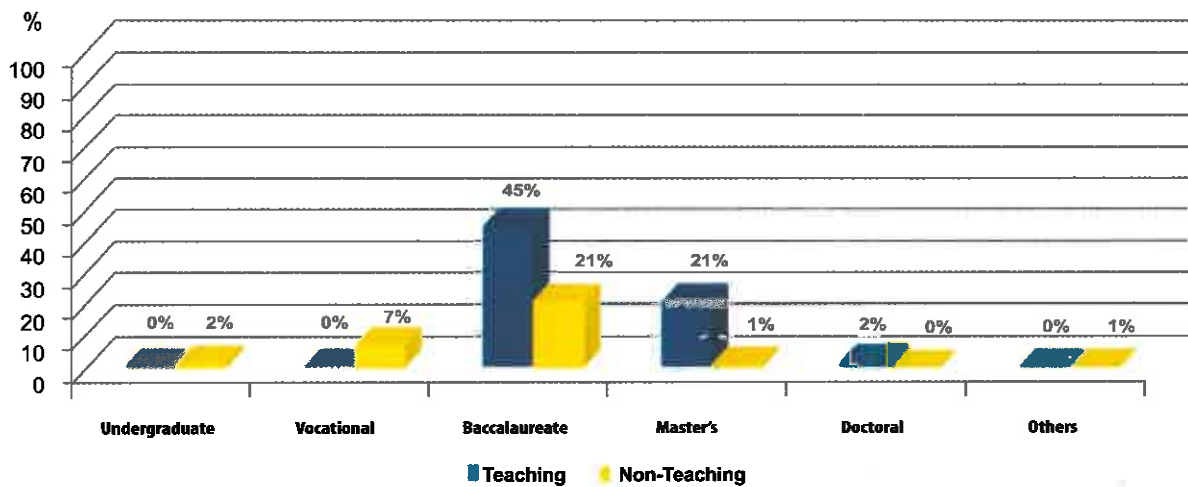

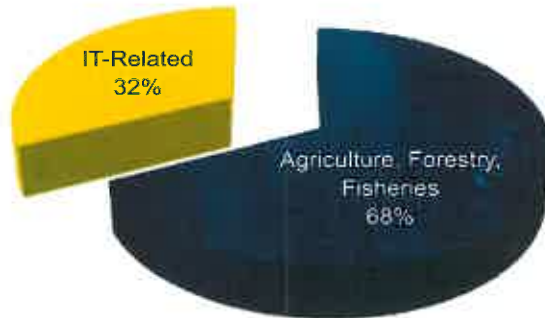

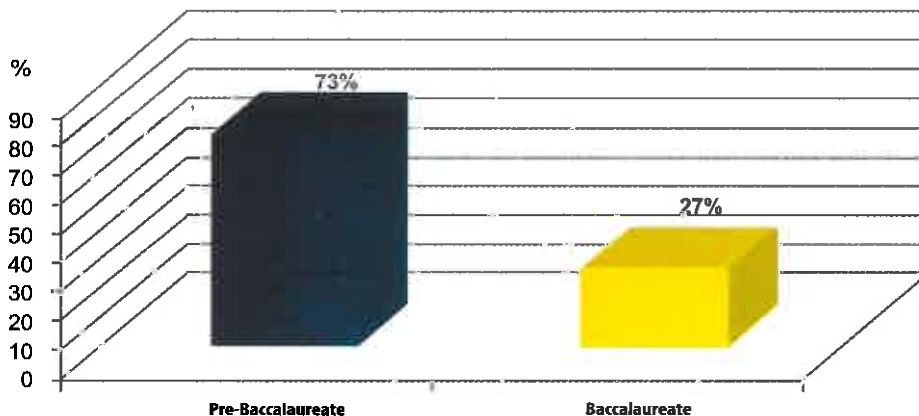
*Figure 15. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2011-2012*

Figure 17. Distribution of Enrolment per Semester by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2012-2013

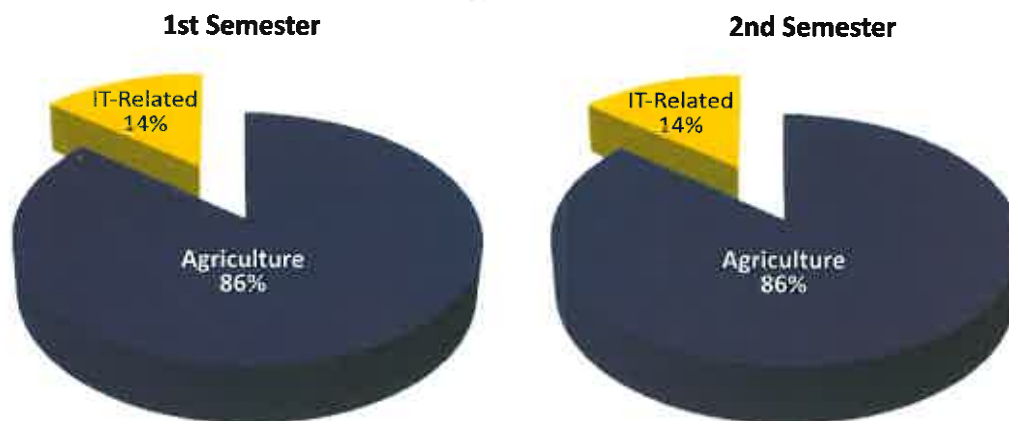

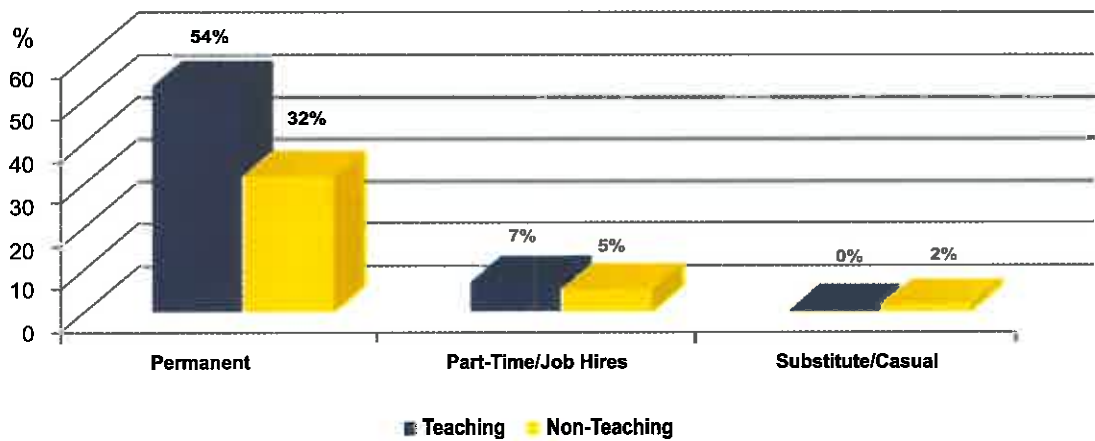

*Figure 19. Distribution of Personnel by Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2012*

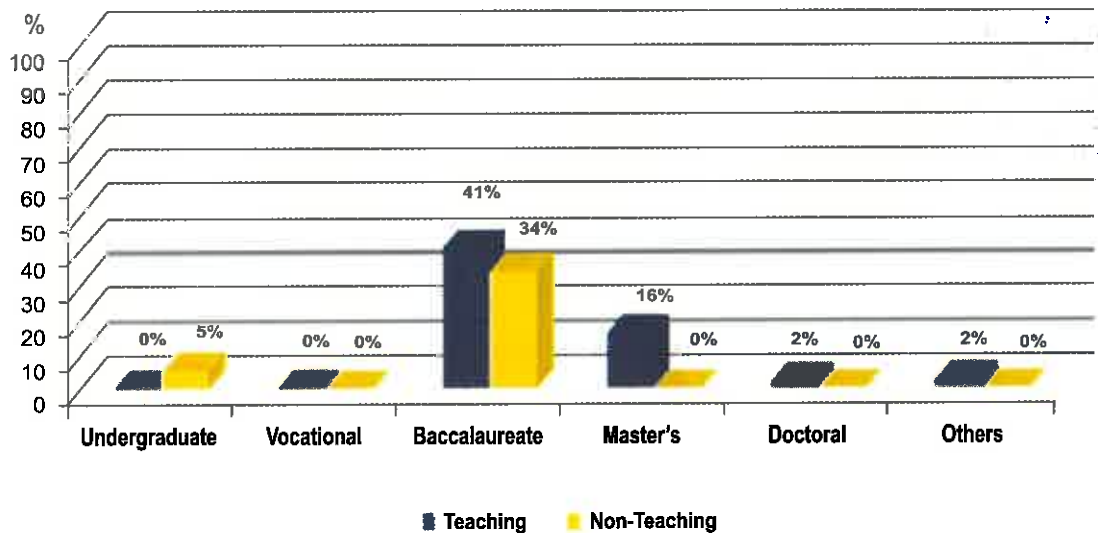

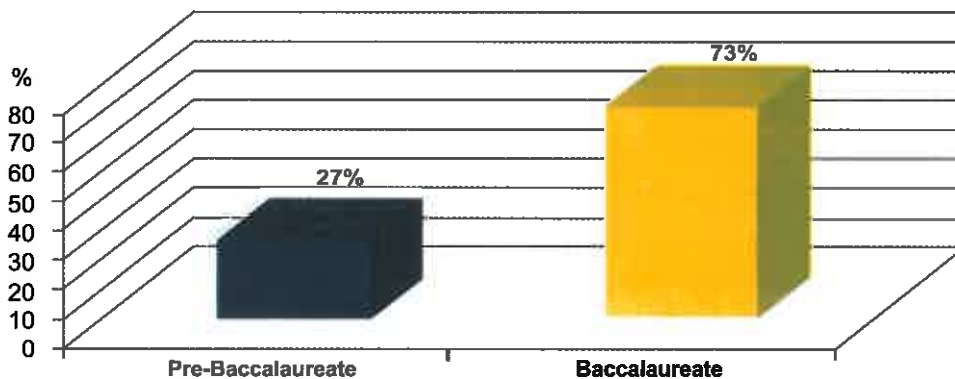
*Figure 20. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2011-2012*

*Figure 21. Distribution of Graduates by Program Level, AY 2011-2012*

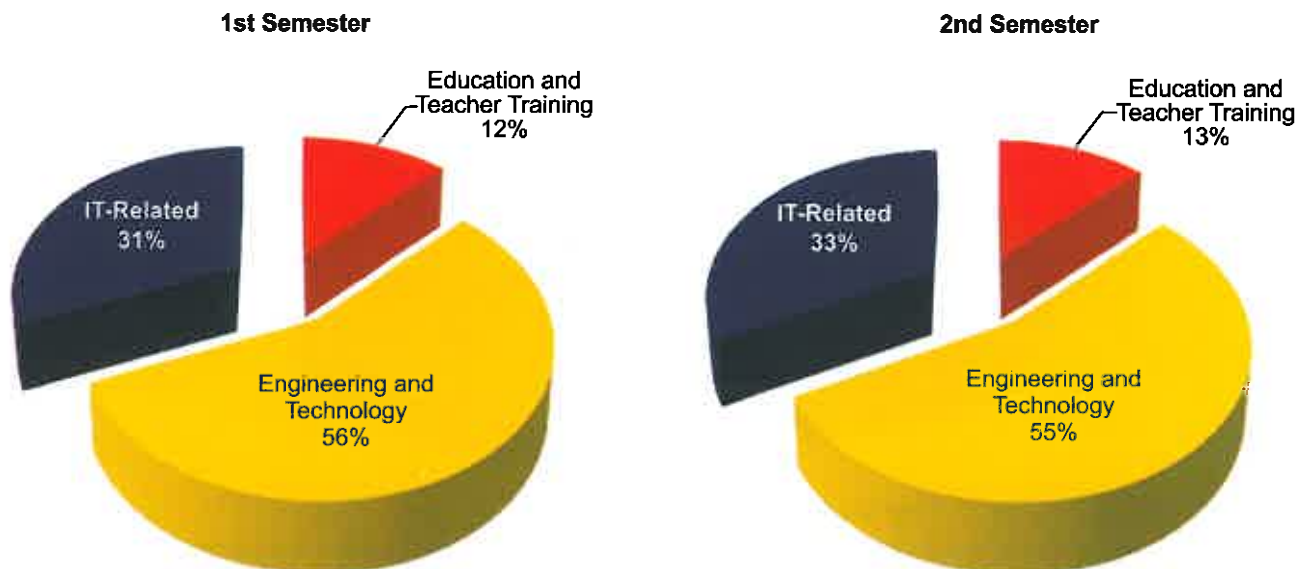

Figure 23. Distribution of Personnel by Employment Status, CY 2012

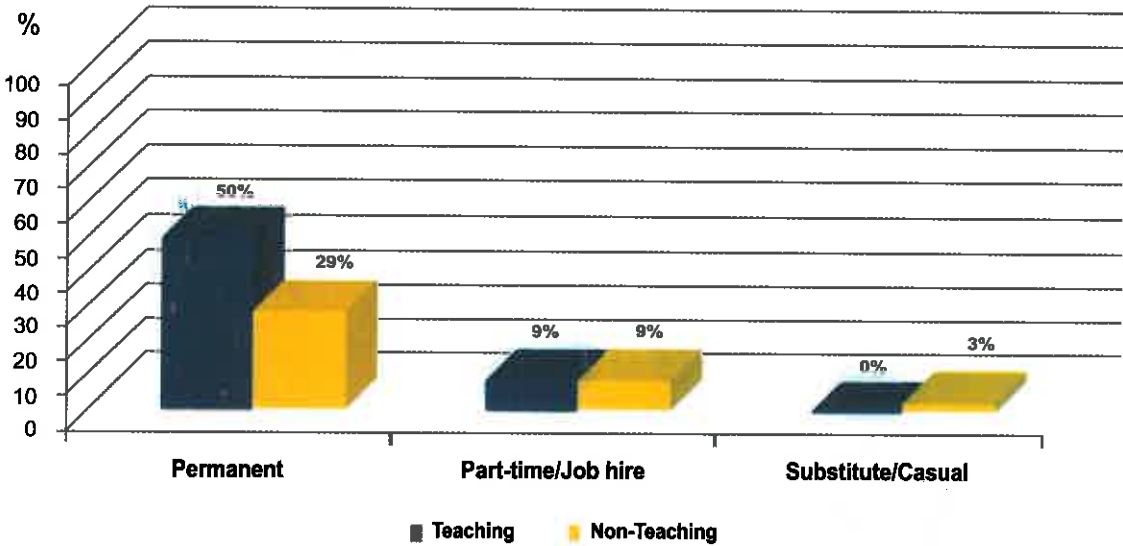


Figure 24. Distribution of Personnel by Highest Educational Attainment, CY.2012

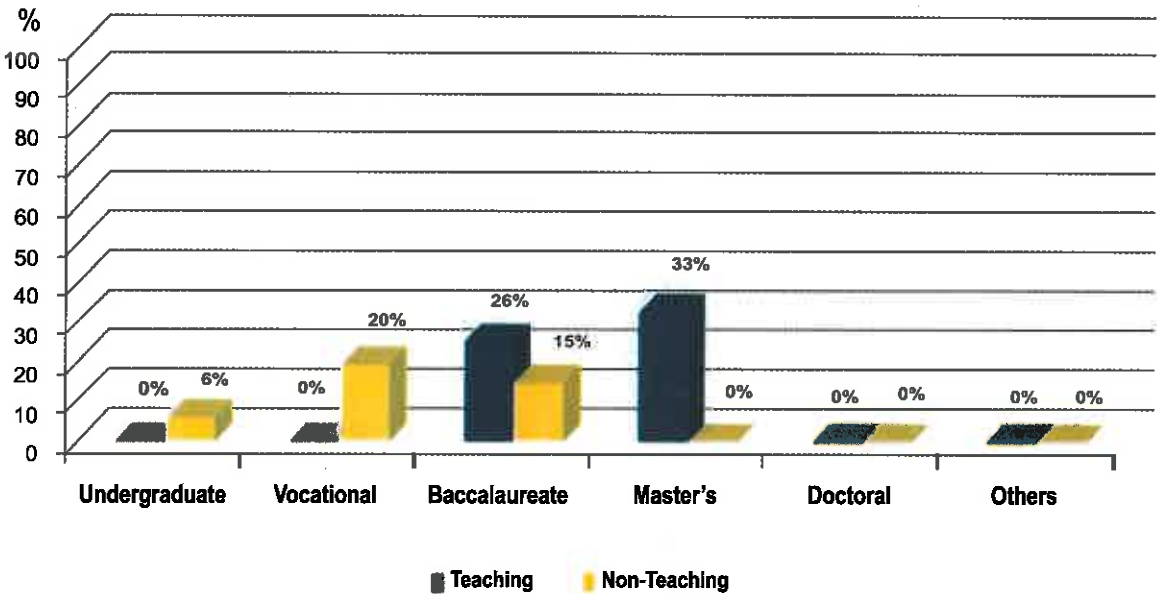

Figure 25. Distribution of Graduates by Cluster of Discipline, AY 2011-2012

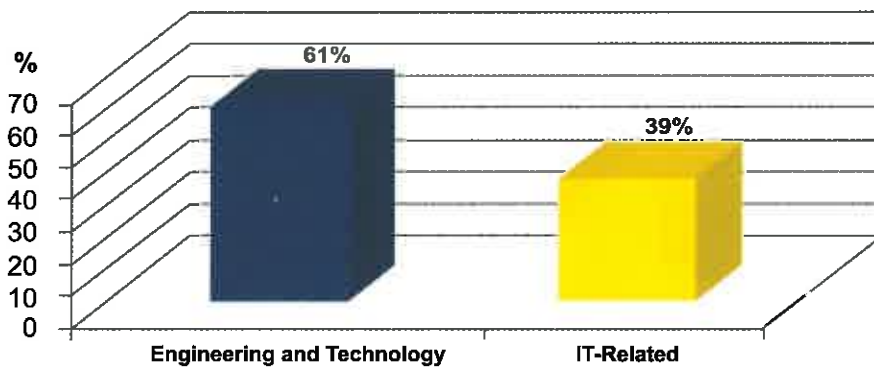
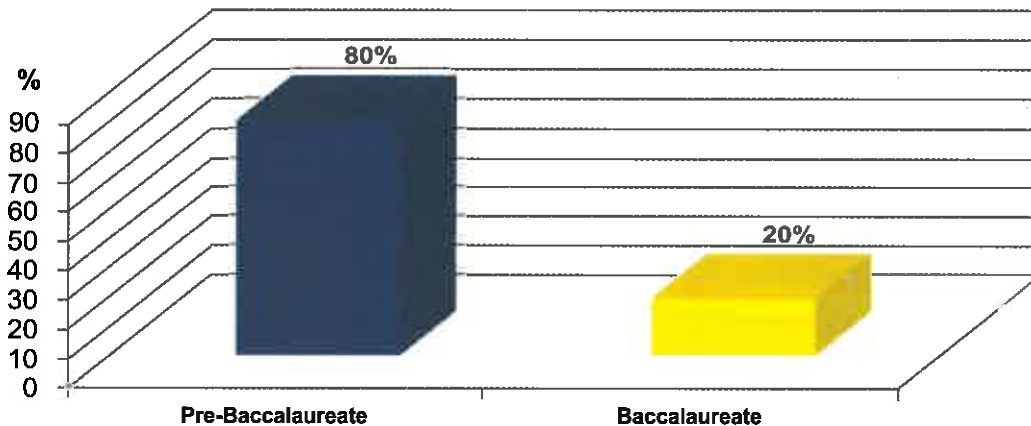

Figure 26. Distribution of Graduates by Program Level, AY 2011-2012

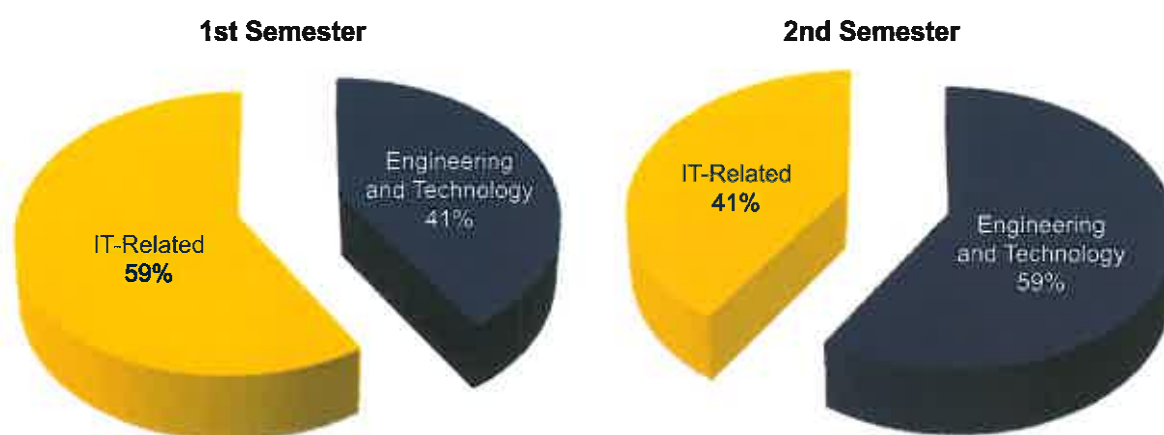

Figure 28. Distribution of Personnel by Employment Status, CY 2012

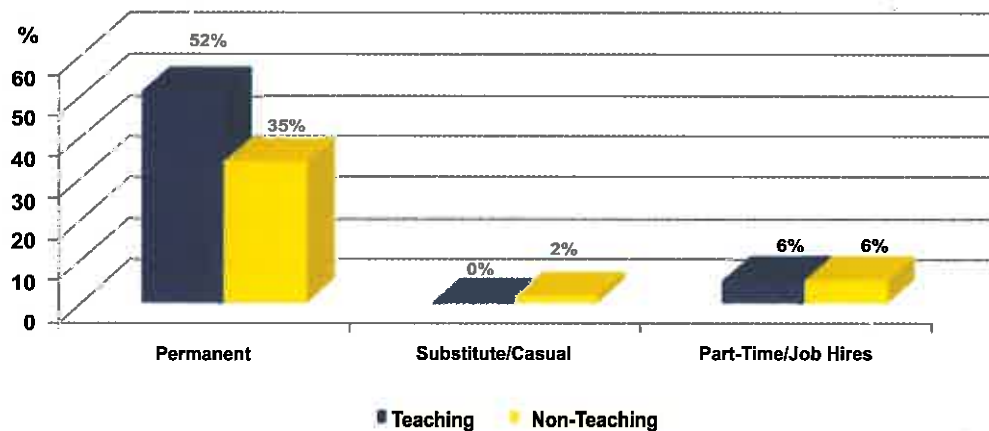


Figure 29. Distribution of Personnel Profile by Highest Educational Attainment, CY 2012

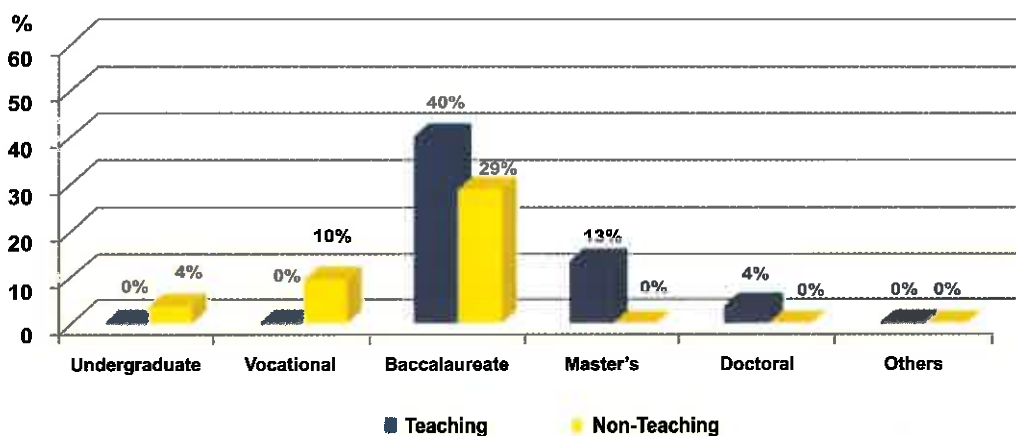
